#### First Reading: The Early Community

Acts 5:12-16

Many signs and wonders were regularly done among the people by the hands of the Apostles. And they were all together in the Solomon's Portico. None of the rest dared join them, but the people held them in high esteem. And more than ever believers were added to the Lord, multitudes of both men and women, so that they even carried out the sick into the streets and laid them on cots and mats, that as Peter came by at least his shadow might fall on some of them. The people also gathered from the towns round Jerusalem, bringing the sick and those afflicted with unclean spirits, and they were all healed.

Response to the Psalm: Give praise to the Lord for he is good, his mercy endures for ever.

#### Second Reading: A Vision of the Lord, Jesus Christ

Revelation 1:9-11a, 12-13, 17-19

I, John, your brother and partner in the tribulation and the kingdom and the patient endurance that are in Jesus, was on the island called Patmos on account of the word of God and the testimony of Jesus. I was in the Spirit on the Lord's day, and I heard behind me a loud voice like a trumpet saying, 'Write what you see in a book and send it to the seven churches.'

Then I turned to see the voice that was speaking to me, and on turning I saw seven golden lampstands, and in the midst of the lampstands one like a son of man, clothed with a long robe and with a golden sash round his chest. When I saw him, I fell at his feet as though dead. But he laid his right hand on me, saying, 'Fear not, I am the first and the last, and the living one. I died, and behold I am alive for evermore, and I have the keys of Death and Hades. Write therefore the things that you have seen, those that are and those that are to take place after this.'

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia. You believed, Thomas, because you have seen me, says the Lord. Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed. Alleluia.

#### The Gospel: Jesus in the Upper Room

John 20:19-31

On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being locked where the disciples were for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you.' When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you.' And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you withhold forgiveness from any, it is withheld.' Now Thomas, one of the Twelve, called the Twin, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, 'We have seen the Lord'. But he said to them, 'Unless I see in his hands the mark of the nails, and place my finger into the mark of the nails, and place my hand into his side, I will never believe.' Eight days later, his disciples were inside again, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' Then he said to Thomas, 'Put your finger here, and see my hands; and put out your hand, and place it in my side. Do not disbelieve, but believe.' Thomas answered him, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him, 'Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed.' Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.

# "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed"

There is a lot going on in today's Gospel from John. The apostles are still living uneasy days after the tumultuous events of the first Easter. For them, and for us, there is a clear message; Jesus cannot be stopped by locked doors and he keeps coming back. No matter the barriers, Jesus will work on doubtful minds and his message of peace never fails.

The fearful apostles are gradually being equipped to go forth, in the place of Jesus. The power to forgive sins is transferred to the apostles and subsequently passed down the priestly ministry as the sacrament of reconciliation. Thomas was not present when Jesus first appeared to his band of frightened humanity in the upper room. Is not his moment of doubt relatable? How many of us, feeling a little left out, wouldn't have responded in the same way? He demanded physical proof and Jesus gives him just that, in a very visceral way, when he appears among them eight days later. Jesus is uncompromising as he confronts Thomas with the wounds inflicted on him by humanity. In so doing, not only does he reinforce the miracle of his resurrection, but he foreshadows the martyrdom which awaits them all. As in Him, human pain will be surpassed by the energising miracle of salvation.

The apostle Thomas will travel far, according to tradition, as far as Kerala, in southern India, where his martyrdom will await him. Let us not define him by this moment of doubt. Perhaps rather than "doubting" we should preface Thomas with "all of us some of the time" In these days of locked doors, the appearances of Jesus shapes the apostles more fully for their mission. They are the founders of the first stumbling communities of Christians, who will often be ostracised. The Gospel writers will provide their sustenance.

It is important for us to recognise our own locked door moments, our fears, our doubts and lay them before Jesus. We reach out to the Living Lord to say "Peace be with you" There is nothing stronger.
