Isaiah 66:10-14c

Thus says the Lord: 'Rejoice with Jerusalem, and be glad for her, all you who love her; rejoice with her in joy, all you who mourn over her; that you may nurse and be satisfied from her consoling breast; that you may drink deeply with delight from her glorious abundance.' For thus says the Lord: 'Behold, I will extend peace to her like a river, and the glory of the nations like an overflowing stream; and you shall nurse, you shall be carried upon her hip, and bounced upon her knees. As one whom his mother comforts, so I will comfort you; you shall be comforted in Jerusalem. You shall see, and your heart shall rejoice; your bones shall flourish like the grass; and the hand of the Lord shall be known to his servants.'

Response to the Psalm: Cry out with joy to God, all the earth.

Second Reading: The Triumph of the Cross

Galatians 6:14-18

Brothers and Sisters: Far be it from me to boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world. For neither circumcision counts for anything, nor uncircumcision, but a new creation. And as for all who walk by this rule, peace and mercy be upon them, and upon the Israel of God. From now on let no one cause me trouble, for I bear on my body the marks of Jesus. The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit, brothers and sisters. Amen.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia. Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts; let the word of Christ dwell in you richly. Alleluia.

The Gospel: The Mission in Action

Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

At that time: The Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them on ahead of him, two by two, into every town and place where he himself was about to go. And he said to them, 'The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few. Therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest. Go your way; behold, I am sending you out as lambs in the midst of wolves. Carry no money bag, no knapsack, no sandals, and greet no one on the road. Whatever house you enter, first say, "Peace be to this house!" And if a son of peace is there, your peace will rest upon him. But if not, it will return to you. And remain in the same house, eating and drinking what they provide, for the labourer deserves his wages. Do not go from house to house. Whenever you enter a town and they receive you, eat what is set before you. Heal the sick in it and say to them, "The kingdom of God has come near to you." But whenever you enter a town and they do not receive you, go into its streets and say, "Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet we wipe off against you. Nevertheless know this, that the kingdom of God has come near." I tell you, it will be more bearable on that day for Sodom than for that town.' The seventy-two returned with joy, saying, 'Lord, even the demons are subject to us in your name!' And he said to them, 'I saw Satan fall like lightning from heaven. Behold, I have given you authority to tread on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy, and nothing shall hurt you. Nevertheless, do not rejoice in this, that the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven.'

In today's Gospel, Jesus "appointed seventy-two others and sent them on ahead of him, two by two, into every town and place where he himself was about to go" to offer Peace, cure the sick and tell the people that the Kingdom of God is very near them. The kingdom of God is not a place, the kingdom of God is God Himself. They are told not to put themselves at risk and God will never disown them. Even though they may encounter danger, they are to carry nothing with them except themselves, and God's Peace.

So, what is God's Peace? It is something that is given unconditionally by God to everyone.

The first reading beautifully describes an image of what God's Peace is like. It describes it as a mother feeding her baby and the baby is safe, secure, and loved, feeling the mother's living heartbeat as it snuggles into her chest. Most of us have experienced the joy of dandling a baby on our lap, perhaps we even sang nursery rhymes, and know that as the baby giggles away, it too shares that experience of love. We are the children of God, and our God dandles us on His lap. That pure love we receive from God is God's Peace.

Jesus not only sends the 72 followers out to tell people that God's Peace is given freely to everyone, but he is also sending us out too. Through our journey in life, Jesus tells us by His written Word, "Your mission, Brothers and Sisters, should you decide to accept it, is to listen to God's voice and His Word. Open your hearts to God's love and Peace. Offer his Peace to those you meet. Receive nourishment from the Eucharist and His Word and show, through your actions and words, Christ to others. You will be loved unconditionally."
