First Reading: Humility. Ecclesiasticus 3:17-18, 20, 28-29

My son, perform your tasks in meekness; then you will be loved by those whom God accepts. The greater you are, the more you must humble yourself; so you will find favour in the sight of the Lord. For great is the might of the Lord; he is glorified by the humble. The affliction of the proud has no healing, for a plant of wickedness has taken root in him. The mind of the intelligent man will ponder a parable, and an attentive ear is the wise man's desire.

Response to the Psalm: In your goodness, O God, you provided a home for the poor.

Second Reading: The City of the Living God. Hebrews 12:18-19, 22-24a

Brothers and Sisters: You have not come to what may be touched, a blazing fire and darkness and gloom and a tempest and the sound of a trumpet and a voice whose words made the hearers beg that no further messages be spoken to them. But you have come to Mount Sion and to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to innumerable angels in festal gathering, and to the assembly of the firstborn who are enrolled in heaven, and to God, the judge of all, and to the spirits of the righteous made perfect, and to Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia. Take my yoke upon you, says the Lord, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart. Alleluia.

The Gospel: Invitations. Luke 14:1, 7-14

One Sabbath, when Jesus went to dine at the house of a ruler of the Pharisees, they were watching him carefully. Now he told a parable to those who were invited, when he noticed how they chose the places of honour, saying to them, 'When you are invited by someone to a wedding feast, do not sit down in a place of honour, lest someone more distinguished than you be invited by him, and he who invited you both will come and say to you, "Give your place to this person", and then you, with shame, will take the lowest place. But when you are invited, go and sit in the lowest place, so that when your host comes he may say to you, "Friend, move up higher." Then you will be honoured in the presence of all who sit at table with you. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted.' He said also to the man who had invited him, 'When you give a dinner or a banquet, do not invite your friends, or your brothers and sisters or your relatives or rich neighbours, lest they also invite you in return and you be repaid. But when you give a feast, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind, and you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you. For you will be repaid at the resurrection of the just.'

Newsletter Reflection for 22nd Sunday of the Year 2025

Okay, I heard this said in jest, but it does seem to illustrate the point that genuine humility seems to be in short supply these days. What a powerful and counter-cultural message we are given in today's readings!

We are living in a world in which many of our most powerful leaders seem to be driven more by ego and self-importance than by a desire to serve the people they are supposed to represent. Often political discussion ends up as a 'blame-game' in which members of all political parties seek to blame the other side for issues facing society rather than working together to find just and lasting solutions which will benefit those most in need.

Globally, the rise in right-wing populism is evidence of a perceived need in many countries to defend a national culture, identity and economy against alleged outsiders. In the UK, recent anti-immigration protests outside so-called asylum hotels are just one example of this attitude.

Contrast all of this with the message of today's readings:

'The greater you are, the more you must humble yourself.' (Sirach 3:18)

'God gives the desolate a home to dwell in.' (Psalm 68)

'Whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted.' (Luke 14: 11)

'When you give a feast, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind and you will be blessed because they cannot repay you - for you will be repaid at the resurrection of the just.' (Luke 14:14)

How far away we are from the values of the Kingdom! Let us pray for peace and justice in our world and in our neighbourhoods. And let us commit ourselves to work for the values of the Kingdom in whatever ways we can.
