First reading: The Vision of Peace. Isaiah 2:1-5

The word that Isaiah the son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem. It shall come to pass in the latter days that the mountain of the house of the Lord shall be established as the highest of the mountains, and shall be lifted up above the hills; and all the nations shall flow to it, and many peoples shall come, and say: 'Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob, that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths.' For out of Sion shall go forth the law, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem. He shall judge between the nations, and shall decide disputes for many peoples; and they shall beat their swords into ploughshares, and their spears into pruning-hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more. O house of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the Lord.

Response to the Psalm: Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord.

Second Reading: The time is near. Romans 13:11-14a

Brothers and sisters: You know the time, that the hour has come for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed. The night is far gone; the day is at hand. So then let us cast off the works of darkness and put on the armour of light. Let us walk properly as in the daytime, not in orgies and drunkenness, not in sexual immorality and sensuality, not in quarrelling and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia. Show us, O Lord, your mercy, and grant us your salvation. Alleluia.

The Gospel: Like a Thief in the Night. Matthew 24:37-44

At that time: Jesus said to his disciples: 'For as were the days of Noah, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day when Noah entered the ark, and they were unaware until the flood came and swept them all away, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. Then two men will be in the field; one will be taken and one left. Two women will be grinding at the mill; one will be taken and one left. Therefore, stay awake, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. But know this, that if the master of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into. Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.'

MAKE A DIFFERENCE THIS ADVENT

There is a wonderful air of mystery surrounding Christmas Carols that have been handed down from generation to generation without any record of their origin. In 1921, a music scholar visiting the town of Policka in Bohemia at Christmastime wrote down a carol sung for him by a Czech peasant girl, it was called 'The Birds.' The carol tells of a cuckoo, a pigeon, and a dove all coming to see the Christ child and expressing their joy that 'Christ was in the world.' The carol inspired the life size Nativity scenes that can be seen to this day, displayed in the market squares of the Czech Republic. Czech Catholics suffered under four decades of Communist oppression (1948 - 1989). The Christmas carol, 'The Birds' was a hymn that carried the people through those very difficult times, embodying a faith that filled the people with the true hope of God with them. Carols can be very powerful.

As can the Crib too. Do you know the very first Crib was made by St Francis of Assisi on Christmas Eve 1223, in Greccio Italy. St Francis wanted to bring the love of God to so many people in a practical way, and his idea of a Crib in the village square had an immediate impact on the local people, many of them returning to the practice of the Faith.

So this Advent why not go 'Carol Singing'? Why not place a Crib at the front of your home or in the window. Such simple things can be powerful reminders to our world today that God has a name, Emmanuel - God with us and for us!
