First reading: A shoot from the stock of Jesse. Isaiah 11:1-10

On that day: There shall come forth a shoot from the stump of Jesse, and a branch from his roots shall bear fruit. And the Spirit of the Lord shall rest upon him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord. And his delight shall be in the fear of the Lord. He shall not judge by what his eyes see, or decide disputes by what his ears hear, but with righteousness he shall judge the poor, and decide with equity for the meek of the earth; and he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall kill the wicked. Righteousness shall be the belt of his waist, and faithfulness the belt of his loins. The wolf shall dwell with the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the young goat, and the calf and the lion and the fattened calf together; and a little child shall lead them. The cow and the bear shall graze; their young shall lie down together; and the lion shall eat straw like the ox. The nursing child shall play over the hole of the cobra, and the weaned child shall put his hand on the adder's den. They shall not hurt or destroy in all my holy mountain; for the earth shall be full of the knowledge of the Lord as the waters cover the sea. In that day the root of Jesse, who shall stand as a signal for the peoples of him shall the nations enquire, and his resting-place shall be glorious.

Response to the Psalm: In his days shall justice flourish, and great peace for ever.

Second Reading: The Generosity of Christ. Romans 15:4-9

Brothers and sisters: Whatever was written in former days was written for our instruction, that through endurance and through the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope. May the God of endurance and encouragement grant you to live in such harmony with one another, in accord with Christ Jesus, that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. Therefore welcome one another as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God. For I tell you that Christ became a servant to the circumcised to show God's truthfulness, in order to confirm the promises given to the patriarchs, and in order that the Gentiles might glorify God for his mercy. As it is written, 'Therefore I will praise you among the Gentiles, and sing to your name.'

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia. Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight; all flesh shall see the salvation of God. Alleluia.

The Gospel: John the Baptist's Call to Repentance. Matthew 3:1-12

In those days John the Baptist came preaching in the wilderness of Judea, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.' For this is he who was spoken of by the prophet Isaiah when he said, 'The voice of one crying in the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the Lord; make his paths straight." Now John wore a garment of camel's hair and a leather belt round his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. Then Jerusalem and all Judea and all the region about the Jordan were going out to him, and they were baptised by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to his baptism, he said to them, 'You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruit in keeping with repentance. And do not presume to say to yourselves, "We have Abraham as our father", for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children for Abraham. Even now the axe is laid to the root of the trees. Every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire. 'I baptise you with water for repentance, but he who is coming after me is mightier than I, whose sandals I am not worthy to carry. He will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor and gather his wheat into the barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.'

Reflection

What lesson can we take from this familiar Gospel this weekend? There are many to choose from; repentance, the simple life of a hermit, baptism, the behaviour of the Pharisees and Sadducees, the coming of the Messiah and His judgement of the people. But, the humility of John the Baptist is what struck me.

John lived a very humble lifestyle in the wilderness and yet his preaching of repentance and his baptism with water was attracting many followers, 'Then Jerusalem and all Judea and all the region about the Jordan were going to him,' He could have established a movement of his own, but he was always very clear that he was not the centre of attention but he was simply the one Isaiah spoke of as, 'The voice of the one crying in the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the Lord: make his paths straight."

When Jesus came to John to be baptised, John said it should be the other way round – Jesus should be baptising John. But Jesus insisted and so left us with an example so we would baptise the nations. We carry on this example of Jesus today every weekend when we welcome new members of our church through baptism.

The greatest illustration of John's humility is in John 3:30 where, when asked about Jesus by his own followers, he said, 'He must grow greater, I must grow less'. He truly prepared the people of Judea for the coming of Jesus and that is all he was interested in. Many of John's followers became disciples of Jesus. All of John's passion, his abilities as a preacher, his followers were not used for his own benefit, they were totally focussed selflessly on Jesus.

As we wait and prepare to celebrate the birth of our Saviour we can strive to embrace some of the humility demonstrated by John the Baptist. How can we become less, so that Jesus grows greater within us and other people see Jesus in our humility?

Advent is a time of preparation and to reflect, and hold onto, the messages of hope, peace, joy and love which God promised to us in the birth of Christ Jesus. Members of our Diocesan Writing Team offer this Advent resource to help guide a daily space for reading of the Scripture, reflection and prayer. In it you will find a reflection based on the theme of each week of Advent and an easy-to-follow reference to the readings for each day. The reflections will be available to view and download on the homepage of the Diocesan website from Friday 28 November www.diocesehn.org.uk. In amongst the busyness of the days and weeks ahead, set aside a little time of quiet and calm daily, or as often as you can, to prepare for the coming of the Lord by reading, praying with and reflecting on the daily readings of Advent.

Advent Candlelit Vigil. You are warmly invited to share in a quiet time of prayer and reflection in preparation for Christmas. The candlelit vigil will take place on Friday 12 December from 6.pm-9pm in Our Blessed Lady Immaculate Church. There will be tea/coffee and mince pies in the Emmaus Room afterwards, so please come for all or part of this quiet time in the run up to Christmas.

The annual Blue Christmas Service will take place on Saturday 13 December at 11.15am also in Our Blessed Lady Immaculate Church. In this service we remember our loved ones who have passed away and whom we miss especially at this time of year. Christmas can be a difficult time for many people for all sorts of reasons. A Blue Christmas Liturgy looks to acknowledge this while offering hope and support for the season ahead.

This Monday 8 December is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, whilst it is not a Holyday of Obligation it is the Feast Day of Our Blessed Lady Immaculate. We will have an extra Mass that day at 9.30am in Our Lady's, which will be offered for the people of the Parish. All welcome.

Mini Vinnies Food Bank. The Mini Vinnies of Our Lady Queen of Peace Primary School will be collecting food items at Our Lady Queen of Peace Church on Sunday 14 December at the 10am Mass. All donations are for their local Food Bank.

Advent Alms. We fundraise for <u>St Cuthbert's Care</u>, our social care charity. This year's collection will help fund a new service supporting women experiencing homelessness, leaving prison or at risk of re-offending. Many of these women have faced trauma, abuse or addiction and some have had few safe spaces in their lives. <u>Donate here</u>.

Last weekend Bishop Stephen wrote a Pastoral Letter to the **Diocese.** It was a message of Advent Hope, amidst the challenges we face as a Diocese. If you missed the letter it can be viewed on the Diocesan website, or you can collect a paper copy from the back of Church. Some of the challenges Bishop Stephen referred to, the increasing age profile of our Priests, Vocations promotion praying together as a community, the present offer of Sunday Masses and the condition of some of our churches and buildings. Bishop Stephen asked us always to remember the Mission of the Church is to Evangelise - to form one another as Missionary disciples. "Decisions must be shaped by local prayer, reflection and dialogue." Throughout 2026 there will be the opportunity in our parishes to come together in prayerful reflective gatherings to share the issues raised in the letter, and see how we as Parishes will respond to the changing situation . All parishioners are invited to these sessions, which will be held in each of our Churches. As Bishop Stephen concluded his letter, "Christ is our hope, and the challenge is to be ready to meet him in the years ahead. Please pray for our clergy, please pray for vocations, and please be generous as we discern our readiness to meet the Lord in the years ahead."
